

# DUNDALK

BALTIMORE COUNTY

WITH A POPULATION OF NEARLY 62,000 RESIDENTS, DUNDALK IS A PLANNED TOWN MADE UP OF MANY HISTORIC HOUSES AROUND A MIXED-USE CENTER DATING BACK TO THE 1920'S. The Town Center, one of the earliest shopping centers in Maryland, features homes and commercial buildings in a livable and walkable environment. The charming historic brick shopping center features the ice-cream shop Scoops, and the Village Coffee House, which serves a variety of sandwiches and salads. The close proximity of neighborhoods in Baltimore City – like Canton and Fell's Point – increase the revitalization potential for Dundalk as an historic suburb that is discovering there is magic in the water.

Designed in 1918, Dundalk is comprised of a series of neighborhoods, many of which have public waterfront parks. In fact, Dundalk features more than 40 miles of waterfront accessibility for recreational activities for residents and visitors alike. The National Historic District in Dundalk is significant for its Garden City plan and luxurious parks designed by the Olmstead Brothers. The town plan was laid out on the Patapsco River in proximity to the industrial jobs supplying the World War I efforts, mainly in ship building and at the Bethlehem Steel mills. Dundalk embraces its ties to World War I and the blue collar workers who lived here. Two charming, linked residential districts were constructed for families to support the job base of ship building and steel production during the war. The housing in these neighborhoods contributes to Dundalk's historic significance and gives the feel of an English village, as intended by the Garden City layout and design.

Dundalk's great fortune is having reached maturity over the past 100 years with its architecture, landscape and water's edge largely preserved. Dundalk has an array of assets to call upon as it welcomes revitalization efforts – accessibility to the metropolitan region, well-designed and affordable housing stock, and great architectural heritage in urban design and park systems.

Come visit Dundalk today – you don't realize what you've been missing.
